






## Arucha (Long)

## Rules

- A bracha arucha starts with the formula "Baruch ata Adonai + eloheinu melech ha'olam"\*
- 2. After the opening (p'ticha) it addresses the theme/s
- 3. At the conclusion (chatima) it ends with "Baruch ata Adonai + the main idea"
- $^{\star}$  The beginning of the *Amidah* is a small exception to this rule



## S'mucha L'chaverta (Leans on its friend!)

## Rules

- 1. Does NOT start with the bracha formula
- 2. ENDS with the shortened formula "Baruch ata Adonai" (chatima)

NB – A chatima NEVER includes the longer formula – only the short one.
